The MSc in Advanced Nursing Practice is a full-time, semesterised programme delivered at the Princess Nourah bint Abdulrahman University (PNU), College of Nursing. It will run over four semesters incorporating lectures, clinical skills education and clinical practicums. It offers a challenging, transformative educational experience for students. Open to qualified nurses, the programme seeks to integrate theory and practice, equipping students with the requisite knowledge and skills necessary to advance their practice enabling them to deliver high quality, safe competent care. The MSc in Advanced Nursing Practice commences on Sept 17th 2017.

Requirements for Award of Degree 120 ECTS credits

Entry Requirements

Minimum entry requirements for the programme are:

- · Hold a Bachelor's degree in Nursing
- Minimum of a 2:1 degree classification or Grade Point Average (GPA) equivalent
- Have a minimum of 2 years postregistration clinical experience

Applicants who completed their higher education outside of an English speaking environment must achieve a composite score of 6.5 in the International English Language Testing System (IELTS) and achieve no less than 6.0 in any component.
