<b>Bilabials</b>	(Lower lip) articulates against (Upper lip)	[p]	[b] [m] [w]
<b>Labiodentals</b>	(Lower lip) articulates against (Upper teeth)	[f]	[v]
<b>Dentals (Interdentals)</b>	(Tongue tip) articulates against (Upper teeth)	[θ]	[ð]
<b>Alveolars</b>	(Tongue tip and/or blade) articulates against (Teeth ridge)	[t] [s] Other alveolars [l] [r]	[d] [z] [n]
<b>Palatals (Alveopalatals)</b>	(Tongue front) articulates against (Hard palate)	[ʃ] [tʃ]	[ʒ] [dʒ] [j]
<b>Velars</b>	(Tongue back) articulates against (Soft palate)	[k]	[g] [ŋ]
<b>Glottals</b>	(Vocal folds) themselves are the place of articulation	[h]	—
