The time is the middle of the 19th Century, before the Civil War.
Trifles	A Play by Susan Glaspell (1876-1948)	Glaspell wrote the play in 1916 for the Provincetown Players,	a Massachusetts acting group that she and her husband, George Cram Cook, founded in Massachusetts in 1915.
