Course Description:

This course looks at the rise and the development of the novel as a literary genre in English literature. The first part of the course will look at the social and historical developments that made the emergence of the novel possible and the second part will take a closer look at one of the most important novels that shaped the development of the genre. Aspects of modern fiction that deal with the fragmentation of the moral and spiritual values and its effect on the form and the content of the novel will be stressed.

Objectives

To familiarize the student with the historical, cultural and literary

background necessary to understand the modern novel.

To help students acquire proficiency in reading modern novels critically and the ability to distinguish styles, structures and modes of the genre.
