<p><i>.Milton narrates the story of Disobedience</i></p> <p>romeo and juliet-1</p> <p>Adam and eve's-2</p> <p>hassan we naeema's-3</p>	2
<p><i>Adam and Eve are the first to disobey God</i></p> <p>human-1</p> <p>all God's creation -2</p> <p>angels-3</p>	1
<p><i>.Satan is the first of to disobey god</i></p> <p>human-1</p> <p>all God's creation -2</p> <p>angels-3</p>	2
<p><i>.....Satan's decision to rebel comes only from</i></p> <p>Adam and eve-1</p> <p>himself-2</p> <p>others-3</p>	2
<p><i>Satan decision to continue to disobey God after his fall into Hell</i></p> <p><i>.ensures that God forgive him</i></p> <p>will-1</p> <p>may be-2</p> <p>will not-3</p>	3
<p><i>Adam and Eve, decide to their sins and seek</i></p> <p><i>.forgiveness</i></p> <p>repent-1</p> <p>insist-2</p> <p>ignore-3</p>	1
<p><i>Unlike Satan, Adam and Eve understand that their disobedience</i></p> <p><i>to God will be corrected through</i></p>	3

<p>follow satan's orders-1 just ignore their sin and move on their live-2 <i>generations of toil on Earth</i> -3</p>	
<p>.....<i>Paradise Lost</i> is about hierarchy only -1 obedience only -2 hierarchy and obedience -3</p>	3
<p>God and Raphael both instruct Adam that Eve is slightly farther removed from God's grace than Adam because she was created to serve only her husband-1 .both God and him -2 only god-3</p>	2
<p><i>are recurring structures, contrasts, and literary devices that can help to develop and inform the text's major .themes</i> <i>Motifs</i>-1 <i>Symbols</i>-2 <i>Themes</i>-3</p>	1
<p>.....<i>Angels are physically described in terms of</i> dark-1 light-2 dust-3</p>	2
<p>..... <i>whereas devils are generally described by their</i> lightning-1 kindness-2 <i>shadowy darkness</i> -3</p>	3
<p>.....<i>Milton also uses light to symbolize</i> adam and eve-1 rebel angels-2 <i>God and God's grace</i> -3</p>	3
<p>Milton divides the universe into major regions two-1 four-2 three-3</p>	2
<p>divides the universe into four major regions: glorious Heaven, dreadful Hell, confusing Chaos, and a young and .vulnerable Earth in between adam and eve-1</p>	3

The..... <i>that Adam makes as he and Eve work separately in</i> <i>.Book IX is symbolic in several ways</i> <i>dress-1</i> <i>castle-2</i> <i>wreath-3</i>	3
<i>;The wreath that Adam makes represents</i> his hate to eve-1 his desire to have children-2 . his love and attraction to eve-3	3
Adam didn't give EVE the wreath he made <i>his shock in noticing</i> <i>; that she has</i> <i>eaten from the Tree of Knowledge makes him drop it to the -1</i> <i>.ground</i> other one on her head-2 left adam forever-3	1

<i>His dropping of the wreath symbolizes that his love and attraction</i> <i>; to Eve is</i> didn't change-1 <i>.falling away -2</i> became stronger-3	2
