6 "It is so gratifying to me when a neighbor comes by with an armful of clothes I would rather have that than a thousand dollars " these are words of an 88-year-old woman, a heroine .she is a woman who places importance on doing for others, those she never met. The people of Malawi were kind to her son when he was in the Peace Corps, and she has returned the favor many times more.
