have something in common (with someone)

• to have the same interests or opinions as someone else

Ronaldo and Messi have something in common. Both are great football players

Vocabulary

• **Horse:** a large animal with four legs which people ride on or use for carrying things or pulling vehicles.

• **Big:** opposite of small. large in size or amount.

• **Scary:** frightening.

• **Guess:** to give an answer to a particular question when you do not have all the facts and so cannot be certain if you are correct.

• **Allergic:** having a strong dislike of something.

• **Shopping:** the activity of buying things from shops.

• **Afford:** to be able to buy or do something because you have enough money or time.

• **Broke:** without money.

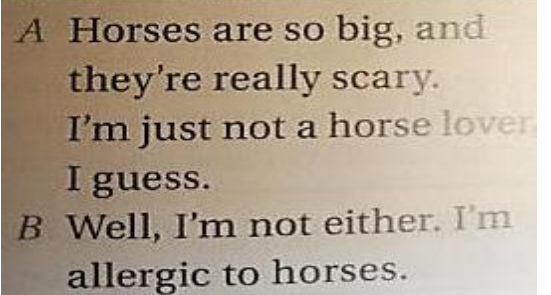

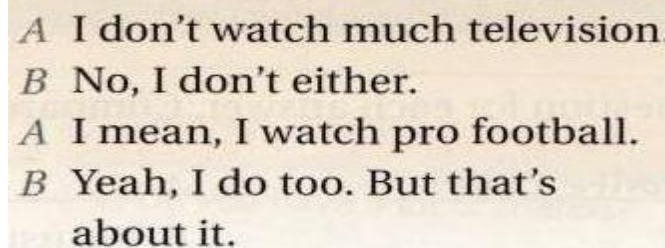


A Horses are so big, and they're really scary. I'm just not a horse lover, I guess.

- They watch pro **soccer**.

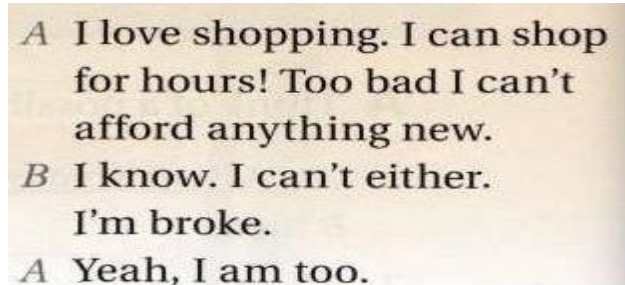


A I don't watch much television.

People also respond with **Me too** and **Me neither** (or **Me either**).

Statements with am:

Affirmative {I+am+too}

Negative {I'm+not+either}

Statements with verbs other than be:

Affirmative {I+do+too}

Negative {I+don't+either}

Statement with the verb can:

Affirmative {I+am+too}

Negative {I'm+not+either}
