To underscore this idea, and express the agony he suffers at the loss of young Hallam, he presents images of youthful joy: the fisherman's son playing with his sister and the "sailor lad "singing in the bay. The poem like any other lyric poem has a pleasing musical quality and presents the deep feelings and emotions of the poet as opposed to poetry that tells a story or presents a witty observation. Nature mourn the death of his friend in sympathy with him. His sorrow is so deep that he can't find adequate words to express it. In stanza1: he express his inability to describe the thoughts in his mind. In stanza2: he envies the happiness of the fisherman's boy who plays with his sister &the sailor who sings happily in his poat In stanza3: he misses the kind of touch and the voice of a friend who is dead. In stanza4: he sets a very important fact "that the happiness of bygone days never comes back"
