This is a paradox. Hope dwells in the human soul but is encountered in wild, alien places. It is part of the self, but is independent of it, is free of human control."

According to cotter (2013), "like many a Connecticut Valley puritan, Emily Dickinson was practical, inventive and private. Dismissing the commercial marketing of poetry as an "auction of the mind," she pioneered a very personal version of desktop publishing, creating 40 hand written, stitch-bound volumes of her own poetry, each in an edition of one."

According to Biography (2016), "born on December 10, 1830, in Amherst, Massachusetts, Emily Dickinson left school as a teenager, eventually living a reclusive life on the family homestead. There, she secretly created bundles of poetry and wrote hundreds of letters. Due to a discovery by sister Lavinia, Dickinson's remarkable work was published after her death—on May 15, 1886, in Amherst—and she is now considered one of the towering figures of American literature.

According to Dickinson (1961) "Hope" is the thing with feathers -That perches in the soul -And sings the tune without the words -And never stops - at all -And sweetest - in the Gale - is heard -And sore must be the storm -That could abash the little Bird That kept so many warm -I've heard it in the chilliest land -And on the strangest Sea -Yet - never - in Extremity, It asked a crumb - of me."
